Thank you for your letter of 22 May regarding Petition P-05-764 from Megan Tudor on Better Mental Health Services for Adults.

I note the issues raised in the petition in respect of adult mental health services.

Regarding the budget for mental health, spending on mental health in Wales is protected by a ring-fence and we spend more on mental health services than any other part of the NHS. We have increased spending each year since the ring-fence was introduced, including £22 million over the last two years which includes more than £3 million a year for psychological therapies for adults. We have announced an additional £20 million this year, taking the total mental health budget for Wales to £629m, compared to £510 million in 2010-11.

Regarding the need for more community services, with the introduction of the Mental Health (Wales) Measure 2010 we set targets that 80% of people should have a mental health assessment by a local primary mental health support service (LPMHSS) within 28 days of a referral. We have since seen a fall in mental health waiting times. In December 2016, more than 85% of people were seen for an assessment within 28 days, compared to just over 60% in December 2013. In addition, 77% of therapeutic interventions were started within 28 days following an assessment last December, compared to around 63% in December 2013.

The Welsh Government has also worked closely with other key agencies including the police, ambulance service and the third sector to introduce a Crisis Care Concordat for Wales. The introduction of the Concordat has led to a dramatic fall in the number of people in a mental health crisis being detained in police custody.
