Llyr Gruffydd AM, Chair said:

"North Wales Assembly Members have agreed to work together on a cross party basis to land some of the big strategic investments that will make life better in North Wales. The Group will campaign for improvements to the region's infrastructure like the A55 and improved connectivity for rural areas.

We will support the North Wales Growth Bid being prepared by the region's six Councils in partnership with the private sector, FE Colleges and Universities in North Wales.

The Group have already met representatives of Growth Track 360 and heard about the rail priorities we need to support.
