The State Aid (EU Exit) Regulations 2019

The Constitutional and Legislative Affairs Committee considered the Welsh Government written statement issued under Standing Order 30C for the above named regulations and your letter dated 25 January 2019 at its meeting on 4 February 2019.

We noted that you state:

"The Welsh Government's position is that State aid is a devolved matter and not a reserved matter under any heading of the Reserved Matters Schedule in the Government of Wales Act 2006. However, the UK Government do not consider it as such (as was noted in the Intergovernmental Agreement) and therefore they have not requested Welsh Ministerial consent. The Welsh Government has requested from the UK Government, an explanation of their legal position but there has been no response."

We are of the view that functions are being transferred to a non-devolved public authority in a way that affects the National Assembly's legislative competence without the consent of the Assembly being sought.

It appears to be a breach of paragraph 8 of the Intergovernmental agreement on the European Union (Withdrawal) Bill, which notes that powers will not be used to enact new policy in devolved areas and that the primary purpose of using such powers will be administrative efficiency.

As such, we endorse the views set out in your letter and written statement. We further note that the Welsh Ministers do not intend on granting to the UK Government unilateral consent for these Regulations.
