are people voted for from different areas of Wales by the people in that local area. Assembly Members represent and speak up for the people in that area. Part of their job is to make laws and check the Welsh Government are doing their best for Wales.

**Assembly
Members**

is an organisation which is made up of elected Assembly Members who represent the interests of Wales and its people, they make laws for Wales, agree Welsh taxes and check the Welsh Government are doing their best for Wales.

**National
Assembly
for Wales**

is made up of the political party that won the most seats at an election and they are usually in charge of this organisation. It decides how to run things like the health service and education and also decide how to spend the country's money.

**Welsh
Government**

is a group of Assembly Members who investigate issues that affect the people of Wales. Each committee will have a special subject they focus on.

A Committee

are the things that say that children need to be safe, healthy and happy.

Children's rights

is the person who speaks up for children and makes sure children know about their rights or that they know where to find out what their rights are.

for Wales**

is an agreement between a country and the United Nations, an organisation that upholds human rights. The agreement says the country will make sure children get the rights listed.
