All these goals are highly desirable. The challenge is that they are expressed as outcomes but without specific metrics (except in a few cases) by which one will be confident that they have been achieved.

It is not clear whether the overall outcome desired would result in Wales still having the same relative position in the UK economy or make a greater contribution and help tackle the deep-rooted spatial imbalances in the UK which affect Wales as much as any part of the UK

No opinion is given on the specific components of spatial strategy since this would be inappropriate given the UK2070 Commission's remit. Dependent on clarification of the extent to which the rebalancing of the UK economy that is needed (see the UK2070 Commission's two reports <http://uk2070.org.uk/>) is accepted as part of the future for Wales, then the spatial strategy might need to anticipate a higher level of growth for Wales, than trend based assumptions would require.

The UK2070 Commission has had explicit regard to the pioneering approach of the Welsh Government to developing policies for promoting the foundational economy. It is not clear as the extent to which this has been built into the spatial strategy.

On an additional point, the draft NDF rightly highlights the need for it to have regard to the challenge of climate change. The emphasis in the document is mostly on addressing the threats that it poses for Wales. The UK2070 Commission, in its own thinking, has done likewise but has also stressed the point that the shift to a zero-carbon economy will also create new opportunities in the new economy that will be required to service Wales and the UK (e.g. not just in energy production but also the manufacturing based required to service it)

3. Affordable Housing (policy 5)

The NDF sets out the approach for providing affordable housing, encouraging local authorities, social landlords, and small and medium-sized construction and building enterprises to build more homes.

The UK2070 Commission accepts the critical need to address climate change (see earlier comment 2). The specific raft of policies to do so need to be tailored to local circumstances to ensure a just transition that helps to address inequalities and not reinforce them. The transition to electric vehicles needs to have regard to this and also to the need to put even greater emphasis on public transport (see second report of Uk2070 Commission)

The NDF identifies three overall regions of Wales, each with their own distinct opportunities and challenges. These are North Wales, Mid and South West Wales, and South East Wales.

The UK2070 Commission has highlighted the need for national Policy frameworks to be underpinned by clear sub-national strategic policies which allow local interpretation of more general national policy goals, deal with issues that are wider interdependencies that can be dealt with by individual and need a collaborative and agreed approach. The UK2070 Commission however does not wish to comment on the detailed specifics for the subregions. It therefore makes no comment below on the following questions

9. North Wales (policies 17-22)

We have identified Wrexham and Deeside as the main focus of development in North Wales. A new green belt will be created to manage the form of growth. A number of coastal towns are identified as having key regional roles, while we support growth and development at Holyhead Port. We will support improved transport infrastructure in the region, including a North Wales Metro, and support better connectivity with England. North West Wales is recognised as having potential to supply low-carbon energy on a strategic scale.
