RG welcomed everyone to the second full meeting of the NAfW Cross Party Group on Transport, and invited everyone to introduce themselves.

The minutes of the previous meeting held on 3 July 2018 were accepted. There were no matters arising.

RG introduced Gloria Esposito, Head of Projects at the Low Carbon Vehicle Partnership. Gloria's presentation covered the importance of low carbon vehicles, and their contribution to reducing emissions, improving wellbeing and reducing health problems. A wide ranging round table discussion ensued, involving most of those present, with questions and answers on some of the points from the presentation. AMs were also able to question transport operators present on specific items. The points included the importance of the bus in reducing emissions, trams/trains, integration, (re)opening of stations, decarbonisation, the role of the bus in the SE Wales Metro, integrated ticketing and parking problems.
